
Summer's Here... So Is Jesus!



I am so excited to share this progress picture of our new organ which will be installed this summer! The Allen Organ Company in Pennsylvania sent me the picture of the finished console still on the factory floor. The organ will move into the final construction stages shortly and then move into a strenuous final testing phase before it is crated for shipping to Florida. One thing to note, however, is that the installation of the instrument is not open to the public. As exciting as it is, the sanctuary will be considered a "construction zone" during the installation. So, it is open to the installation teams only. We will still have worship on Saturdays and Sundays as usual. I will update our social media account with progress pictures and descriptions so everyone can follow the progress of the installation remotely.
