Becoming a Confirmed Member of St. Michael

This summer, we evaluated both our youth and adult programs to become confirmed members of St. Michael and made some changes. Pastor Dave is looking forward to being a part of the programs for both adults and youth!

- Foundations of Faith—Adults who wonder what Lutheran Christians believe, want a refresher on Lutheran doctrine or would like to become members of St. Michael can attend Sundays, September 15 through October 20 from 9:15 to 10:30am in the cafeteria.
- Ninth Grade Confirmands—Ninth graders who have completed their confirmation instruction will meet with Pastor Dave and Lori Schwan on Wednesday, September 11 from 6:00 to 8:00pm for a final review in preparation for the rite of confirmation at our combined 10:00am worship service on Sunday, October 27.
- Youth Confirmation Modules—We will be having seven learning modules on Sundays scattered throughout the year from 12:15 to 4:00pm with lunch provided. Students will also be given a project to work on at home for each module. Student in grades six through twelve will be able to complete these modules over one year or several. Students currently in eighth grade will only need to work through the modules that they didn't cover last year. We will have several LCMS-trained church workers who will be leading the classes. Parents will be asked to attend some of the modules. Students who have completed all seven modules along with a cumulative review will then be confirmed. The first of these modules (covering the Apostles' Creed) will be led by Pastor Dave on Sunday, September 15 in the cafeteria.

The organ installation is now complete! It went off without a hitch... but with lots of sore muscles and a few headaches with the attic chamber where the speakers are located being five feet tall at its highest point and sloping down to three feet in some places. It clearly wasn't designed for someone of my size! Because of the preparation work we did prior to



the organ's actual arrival, we cut a two-and-a-half week installation down to four days! Everything went smoothly with the installation, and the organ spoke in our sanctuary for the first time on Thursday, August 1 and was blessed in all three of our worship services on August 3 and 4. I would like to give a huge thank you to everyone who made this installation possible. The new organ is an absolute delight to play! It can be delicately and intimately soft or thunderously loud, and everything in between. It integrates most of the previous pipe organ with tons of new digital additions which allow the organist a much greater palette of sound capabilities. I look forward to introducing you to its many tonal abilities in both worship and concerts.
