

Reformed or Reforming? Why Not Both?

October 31 will mark the 507th anniversary of Martin Luther posting the 95 Theses on the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Since that date in history, much has unfolded not only in Christendom but in the world. To some extent, I think the reformer would be delighted with the technological advances that have been made with technology that has increased access to spreading the Gospel across the world. In other instances, he would probably be very disappointed that some who call themselves Christian or even Lutheran have abandoned core truths of the Christian faith. In some ways, it seems that the reformation within the Holy Christian Church is spoken of from an historical perspective. Tours are regularly offered to Wittenberg where one can visit the sites where Luther lived and preached and taught. But, the Reformation is not only about visits to historic locations via a tour bus. It was and is a vital movement for truth and life in the Church of Jesus Christ.

To answer the first part of this article's title, yes, we are Christians who have been reformed by the Word of God. The 'solas' of the Reformation still hold true: sola scriptura (the Bible is the only authority for Christians in faith, doctrine and practice), sola fide (salvation is found in faith in Jesus Christ alone), solus Christus (salvation is found in Christ alone), sola gratia (salvation is a gift of grace from God, not a result of human merit), soli Deo gloria (salvation is a work of God for His glory).

But, we are also Christians whom the Lord continues to reform within His Church in the present age. We need to always be reforming because we fail to understand and follow God's truth as we ought. Always reforming does not mean adapting or adjusting doctrine because the times have changed. Rather, it means turning as the Reformers did to the Word of God to allow it to change us, and, as we are changed, we bring that change to bear upon the needs of the present day.

The beauty in this truth is that the commission that Christ has given to His Church (Matt. 28:18-20) never has to be compromised for it stands outside of the bounds of all cultural whims and oppressions. Continuing to share the good news of the Gospel, that Jesus has indeed fulfilled all righteousness, has conquered sin and death and the devil for all people and is ushering in the new and everlasting creation through His Church, remains our sole aim and purpose. Throughout the centuries, the

Church has had seasons of serious decline in doctrine or life and must be reformed. Other times, Christians may become convinced that the Church needs to grow

faster and the only way for that to happen is drastic reform. Only a continued, close examination of the Word will continue to guide us to determine which is true. So, are we a congregation of the Reformation or a congregation that continues to be reformed? The answer is yes. As Dr. Luther said of the Reformation in his day, "The Word did it." So, of all good, continuing reformation within the Church and our lives we stand in agreement: "The Word must do it."

He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear the LORD and put their trust in him. -Psalm 40:3






Thank You from One of Our Share the Music Scholarship Students
