### "The Hand of the Lord Leads Us to Lent"

One of the most useful yet underrated gifts God has given to us is our hands. Without giving it much thought, we use our hands for so many daily chores and activities. With our hands, we heal, mend, build, teach, comfort, pray, serve and complete acts of love God calls us to do for our neighbor. Yet, as humans our hands are sinful and unclean. There is not a single cleansing agent on the market today that can wash away the sin that our hands commit. In our corporate confession during worship, we call to mind the fact that "we have sinned against You, Lord, in thought, word, and **deed**, by what we have **done** and what we have left **undone**." Our hands, our heart and our very soul need cleansing and restoration.

This Lenten season, we will experience how Christ's hands are the

ones that can transform our dirty, sinful hands into beautiful, clean ones for His plans. Join us on Ash Wednesday (March 5) at noon or 6:30pm as we begin this journey with our Lenten series entitled *The Hand of the Lord*. Each weekend in worship and on Wednesday evenings at 6:30pm, we will explore God's Word to see how His hands are used in both the New and Old Testaments from creation to crucifixion and eternal life.



On Wednesday, April 2 at 6:30pm, we will have a special guest join us who is an author, poet, podcaster and speaker, Tanner Olson. You can learn more about Tanner at his website <a href="www.writtentospeak.com">www.writtentospeak.com</a>. Tanner will bring us a unique perspective of what the hand of the Lord means.

As we approach Holy Week, we will be celebrating first Communion prior to confirmation for the first time in St. Michael's history. This will

be on Maundy Thursday (April 17) at 6:30pm worship. This is part of our confirmation course which is offered to students beginning in fourth grade. First Communion prior to confirmation is not mandatory for students but is offered to students with the approval of their parents. As part of our first Communion celebration, Jews for Jesus will be joining us to present "Christ in the Passover." Sahar Sadlovsky, a student at Fort Wayne Seminary in Ft. Wayne, Indiana will share how the Old Testament Passover links us to the Lord's Supper we celebrate as Christians today. I look forward to contemplating and celebrating this important aspect of our life and faith in Christ with our young people and with you.



## Maundy Thursday: The Seder Meal



Join us in the gym on Thursday, April 17 at 6:30pm to observe Maundy Thursday with a seder meal. This powerful experience will illustrate the link between the Jewish feast of Passover and the last supper Jesus shared with his disciples with the sensory exploration of the beautiful Jewish ceremony called a seder. As we taste the traditional symbolic foods, we will weave the story of the Jewish exodus from slavery together with the messianic hope realized in Jesus' life, death and resurrection. The words "given and shed for you" will take on an even deeper meaning to Christians as we learn the significance of the tradition Jesus observed the night before He died. It will also give us a closer look at the very Jewish life Jesus led. At this seder, our first Communion students will take part in this very important sacrament with their families.
